Events include a Science Fair, short film showings, Nature Trail opening, recycled craft workshop, poetry session, mini exhibitions, and story-time workshops.






Partnering with local organizations, they offer activities like pebble painting, sunflower planting, treasure hunts, bug hunts, and litter picks.

Reception Adventures this week...

The week started off with the exciting story of Spinderella by Julian Donaldson. We then acted out parts of the story by taking on the role of spiders to have a football match! It was also a great chance to use our knowledge of numbers to sort out team groups and make sure they were fair.

Our exploration of spiders continued as we wrote some fantastic sentences all about them and carried out a variety of activities including making creative spiders using playdough.

On Wednesday we happily made our way to the forest, along with the sunshine, to continue our adventures. On Friday we were treated to a visit to Mrs Taylor's garden to explore her beautiful flowers. We were extremely excited to see the irises in bloom and we thought they looked just as beautiful as Van Gogh's fabulous painting.

Year 1

Year 1 have had a lovely week! In maths, we have been learning to count in 2s, 5s and 10s. The children have really impressed Miss Barker and Mrs Sadya with their determination and dedication as they have completed sewing their puppets. We are all looking forward to decorating them next week. In English, the children have finished drafting and editing their report on a big cat and have begun writing up their final piece today.





Year 2

Year 2 have had a week full of learning. Miss Murphy has been teaching the children this week and they have enjoyed learning about lots of interesting things. In English, they have been drafting their own versions of

instructions on how to make bread. We can't wait to see the final piece next week! In maths they have been continuing their learning on fractions. The children are becoming more confident with working with different shapes and amounts. In History they have been researching Marie Curie and why she is so significant. The children have placed her on a timeline and have also been exploring what other inventions were going on at the same time! Well done year 2 on a great week!

Year 4

It has been another incredibly busy week in Year 4, albeit with only being in four days! In maths, we have completed our decimal units for this year, and we have started our new unit of money! The children have found it very useful using the plastic coins to represent different amounts of money. The children have started to write a fantastic piece of writing! They have created a story to detail the dangers of electricity! We have also been exploring the mystery surrounding Tutankhamun and we have been debating whether he died of natural causes or that he was murdered! We finished off the week by creating a bar chart to represent languages spoken worldwide! The children were amazed to learn that English is the second most spoken language in the world! Reading Corner


This week's recommended read is for children aged 11+...
