Think Before You Park

It's the first full week back and the school run can be hectic. Staffordshire Police and their partners are urging parents and carers to park safely, considerately and legally around schools.



Over the next two weeks they are highlighting the need to be aware of pedestrians, other roads users and local residents when dropping your children off or picking them up from school. One way to ease congestion is that if you can't walk to school from your home consider parking further away from the school and walking the last five or 10 minutes.

There are rules on parking, make sure you aren't parking dangerously or causing issues for others. It's important that you do NOT park:

- on zig zags and double yellow lines
- in a way that blocks access for emergency vehicles
- opposite to or near to a junction
- on a bend
- near the brow of a hill
- near a school entrance, bus or tram stop
- over or on the driveway of a property
- over a dropped kerb
- on the pavement this can cause problems for parents with prams, wheelchair or mobility scooter users and the elderly.
- on or near crossing points where a school crossing patrol operates, this can impede their view, making the crossing unsafe

Another common issue is drivers leaving their engine running when waiting for their children. Idling increases, the amount of exhaust fumes in the air and therefore reduces the air quality around the school where children are walking. Consider the environment and the health of the local community and turn the engine off when you're parked up.

This new school year make a resolution to be a #ParkingStar and think before you park. Residents living near to schools who have concerns or issues regarding parking can find further information on the Staffordshire County Council website here.

Let's have a sneaky peek as to what has been going on in our classrooms this week...

Nursery

Nursery children have loved exploring their new learning environment this week and getting to meet new friends. They have enjoyed painting, role play, riding on the bikes and scooters, exploring small world lands and being creative with the playdough. For most children, this is their first time away from parents, so we are so proud with how they have coped during this important transition week.

Reception

The children in Reception have had a fantastic first week at school and we have been so proud of how well they have settled in.

They have enjoyed joining in with lots of exciting activities throughout the various areas of learning. They have had a great time taking part in group activities which have encouraged them to become more familiar with their new friends in the class. There was lots of fun and



laughter as they took part in some parachute games and showed fantastic team work as they managed to bounce the teddy the whole way around the group!

The children have also enjoyed singing some of their favourite rhymes and sharing some fabulous books. We have been very impressed with their super listening and speaking skills.

As with our class routines the transition to the hall for lunchtime was a huge success as the children followed this very well and used wonderful manners as they collected and enjoyed their food.

We are very excited to begin for the children to begin their first full week in Reception next week!



Year 1

Year 1 have settled in wonderfully. This week we have been focusing on practising classroom routines and getting to know one another. In English we have been exploring the book 'Room on the broom' by the fantastic author Julia Donaldson. From this the children have worked in groups to design and build their own 'new and improved' broomsticks for the witch. In Maths we have been focusing on our numbers 1-10 and how we can represent them

in many different ways. In PSHE we have been exploring the objective feeling special and safe. For this we have placed names of all the children into balloons. Each morning we will pop a balloon and celebrate that individual by presenting them with a certificate, having a dance around them in a circle and finally they can be the leader of the line for the whole day. I cannot wait to continue to grow and learn alongside your children.

Year 2

What a fantastic week Year 2 have had! They have started off their Year 2 journey with enthusiasm and positivity and are tackling every new challenge and routine with a smile on their face. In Maths the children have started their learning on Place Value to 100 and have demonstrated a brilliant understanding of 10s

and 1s. In Music the children have been learning about 'The Carnival of the Animals'. They have appraised the 14 different pieces of music and written a short summary of their favourite piece which will be displayed in the KS1 corridor. In the afternoons the children have been learning about Materials in Science and have enjoyed exploring the classroom and outdoor areas and making scientific observations. Other exciting firsts have been the return of assemblies, eating in the hall and mixing with the other children in KS1 and EYFS!

During our afternoons, we have explored our topic, 'Victory Is Ours' based on World War Two, starting by ordering key events on a timeline and looking at various historical sources.




Reading Corner


