Nursery Adventures this week...

It has been an exciting, fun-filled week in Nursery with lots of festive activities. The children have loved opening the class advent calendar, finding the correct number on the door and have been removing Santa pictures from five frames to work out how many sleeps are left until Christmas. Their progress and confidence in being able to talk about what do you notice and what do you see has been wonderful! We have also been very creative and have seen lots of sparkles and glitter in our creative area as the children completed some wonderful Christmas artwork involving snowflakes and Christmas trees. In addition, the maths area has also been filled with Christmas



themed activities as the children decorated their snowman using their understanding of subitising and used beads and blocks to show different patterns whilst decorating their scarves for their snowman!

Reception Adventures this week...

We have enjoyed learning about keeping our teeth healthy with a focus on brushing. After sharing the fantastic story, 'Jungle Mouth', by Lana Simkins we had lots to discuss about the importance of keeping our teeth clean.

"We brush our teeth, so we don't get cavities in them, it's a little black hole in our tooth!" (Ava. C)

We continued our tooth adventures by sequencing the correct way to brush our teeth, learning a tooth brushing song and exploring different models including brushing them until they sparkled! We also used our phonics knowledge to write messages to Jordy from Jungle Mouth to remind him how to keep his teeth healthy.

Our week has also been full of festive wonder as we have decorated Christmas trees, shared Christmas

It was super exciting when we had the choice of lots of different materials to create a Christmas tree for our cards, our designs are fantastic, all different, unique and special just like us!



Year 1

Year 1 have had a lovely week looking at what is different between each of them. This has linked into our PSHE unit Celebrating Differences. We have drafted our letter in English and are looking forward to writing the final version next week. In maths, we have been looking at patterns with 2D and 3D shapes.

Year 2

Year 2 have had an excellent week and have been exploring non-chronological reports. They have been gathering information about King Charles III in preparation for writing their own non-chronological report. In maths they have continued looking at addition and subtraction and have been finding the difference in numbers and starting to look at word problems. This week, Year 2 also had their Nativity performance and what a show it was! The children performed brilliantly and had such a fun time doing it! I want to thank all of the parents and families for coming along to support the children! Well done Year 2!

Year 3

Year 3 have had a great week! They have been working hard to write their own poem in English. During Maths, they have been solving word problems involving multiplication and division. They have become confident with their 4 and 8 times tables! In Art we have been looking at how families are depicted throughout different eras. Two artists we have studied are Susan Lordi, who created Willow Tree ornaments and Henry Walton. We also had the opportunity to showcase our Christmas performance and we are so proud of all the children! Thank you to Year 3 parents for your support with learning lines, songs and gathering great costumes, as always it is very much appreciated!



Year 4

We have had another wonderful week in Year 4 this week. In maths, the children have been identifying what happens when you multiply and divide a number by itself and 0. In English, the children have written some fantastic information texts about teeth, how to keep our teeth clean and why it is important to keep our teeth clean! I have enjoyed reading them so much and moving forward, we are planning to show our information texts to the younger years to explain the importance of brushing our teeth. Elsewhere this week, we enjoyed our last session at Forest School. We had the opportunity to cook pancakes on a fire, take part in a Christmas themed chocolate hunt and even finished off with a sing song! A wonderful penultimate week of the term Year 4!

Year 5

Despite it being the penultimate week of term, the learning is not slowing down in Year 5. In English, the children have continued writing their 'Alien Invasion' stories and are VERY almost at the end! In Maths, Year 5 have continued their work on fractions, including ordering and comparing fractions below and above 1. In Science, Mrs Wilkinson taught the children about irreversible changes, such as lighting a candle and dissolvable tablets. Music had a Christmas twist as the children used their newfound glockenspiel skills to play 'Walking in the Air'. In Computing, the children have continued their unit of learning on Video Production and were able to use story boards to video different scenes for a whole class video.

Year 6

What a lovely week we have had! On Monday, we continued with our Maths learning about measure where we looked at word problems and had to convert them to the same unit of measurement to solve the problem. In English, we have been busy writing our individual reports on how our chosen animal has adapted to its environment. In Science, we applied our knowledge of conductors and insulators and answered questions based on our steady hand games we made for our DT project last month. We looked at why we used tinned copper for the wire part of our game and why we used plastic for the handle. We finished 'Hana's Suitcase' in Reading and worked in groups to summarise the text, where we created a poster of everything we could remember.


