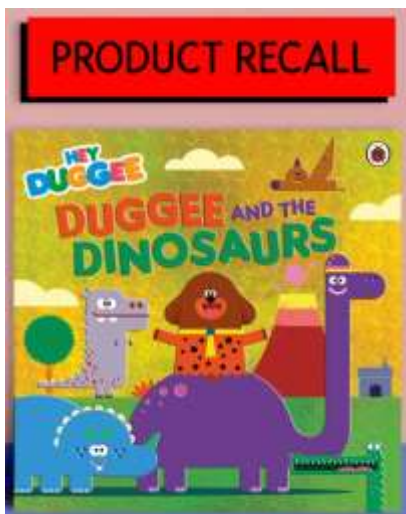

## School Uniform Exchange

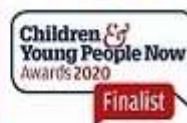

## Nursery

The Nursery children have had a wonderful week and as always, have been busy accessing the learning opportunities available to them with such enthusiasm and independence! This week we talked about holidays in the past compared with today. Looking at lots of black and white photos, the children were highly amused by the bathing machines, clothing worn and the old cameras used to capture these memorable moments! We have also continued to learn lots of new action songs which Mrs Farrington has had the pleasure of watching via Seesaw, as children have performed them at home. Very well done to everyone, on another brilliant week!

## Reception

The children have had a fun week in Reception learning about odd and even numbers in maths. They have enjoyed carrying out lots of activities including making odd and even monsters to show their understanding of this.

The children have also discussed different items to pack for a holiday and thought carefully about the different places they could visit as they quickly identified not all destinations would be sunny and hot! They then completed some wonderful writing to show what they would pack working hard to apply their phonics skills.

They have also been exploring junk modelling and used a variety of materials to create different items that can be found at the seaside. These included fish, ice creams, sandcastles and shells. The children were very imaginative and developed their models by thinking carefully how they could improve them.



## Year 1

Record-breaking resilient readers...that is what the Year 1 children have been this week! Miss Martin-Mills and the rest of the Year 1 team are so incredibly proud of every single child in the class for the effort they have been putting into their reading recently. In other areas of the curriculum, Year 1 have been just as successful! In Maths the children are on their final unit of learning - money. ## Year 2

## Year 3

Year 3 have had a very fun and interesting time this week! The children have been preparing to perform the Jabberwocky by Lewis Carroll off by heart on the stage to the rest of the class! They have had lots of fun preparing props, masks, and drawings for this, I look forward to seeing their performances! The children have also been doing lots of computing work, learning all about coding. They have all been keen to learn all about this, creating their own sequences and discovering all the different ways of coding on Purple Mash! Well done Year 3, it has been a lovely week!

## Year 4

The children in Year 4 have enjoyed this week as they have been designing a juggling ball in design and technology. The pupils have used a tie-dyeing technique to create a pattern on the material before sewing the juggling ball together. The children have continued to work hard this week when planning a newspaper report about an Egyptian artefact which was found on the school field. The pupils interviewed Mr. Adams about the incident and the pupils will include quotes in their articles.

## Year 5

The pupils in Year 5 have been working really hard this week, especially in their assessments. They have learnt about the importance of self-esteem in PSHE with Mr Carlin and have been preparing for sports day by improving their throwing techniques! Wednesday saw Year 5 begin their Batik artwork by considering colour for their geometric designs and completed their watercolours of early Islamic art. The pupils learnt about the process of metamorphosis in certain insects as well as learning about important religious figures, this week Rabbi Jonathan Sacks. Keep up the good work Year 5!

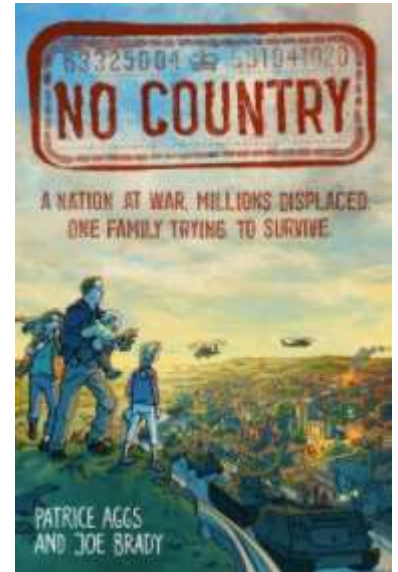
### Reading Corner

This week's recommended read is for children aged 9+...

#### No Country

by Patrice Aggs and Joe Brady

Set in an unspecified time not too dissimilar to now, and in a country that strongly resembles our own, this tense, gripping graphic novel demonstrates just how quickly civilisation can fall apart. Bea lives with her dad, big sister and little brother; her mother has already had to flee their country, which is in the midst of a civil war, the forces of the state fighting the rebel Free Kingdom movement, with civilians bearing the brunt, enduring food shortages, power cuts and bomb attacks along with casual brutality from both sides. The family know they'll have to leave soon, and the book describes the events that trigger their decision to go and live as refugees. The story describes what it's like to live in a society where trust has collapsed, and where everyone is scared and desperate. But it underlines too the power of family to hold together during the most difficult times and the importance of hope. Powerful and original, it makes for thought-provoking reading, text and illustrations carrying a very strong message.

# Covid digital passport scam

A new email scam about Covid is circulating and we want to advise you what it looks like and what steps you can take.



**Your vaccination status is obtained FREE through the NHS App, website or by calling the NHS on 119.**

**Send suspicious emails to the Suspicious Email Reporting Service (SERS) at [report@phishing.gov.uk](mailto:report@phishing.gov.uk).**

You may receive an email which looks similar to the one shown. Clicking on the link takes you to a convincing but fake NHS website that asks for personal and payment details. (for an admin fee).

The website has since been taken down, however, as with many scams of this nature, there will be others.
