Reception Applications!

B5017 Shobnall Road / Forest Road, Burton upon Trent - Proposed Carriageway Patching Works

The school received an email this week with reference to a package of carriageway patching works along Shobnall Road / Forest Road that will begin in late January 2023. This will inevitably have an impact on our community with the school being located so centrally to where this work is due to be carried out, so we wanted to inform our parents and carers as soon as possible as this will effect your journey to and from school during this time.

The works will see Amey Services Ltd working with Staffordshire County Council to undertake several deep construction carriageway patches at five locations along both Shobnall Road and Forest Road.

The works are required following the carriageway recycling scheme of 2019, and whilst every effort is made by Staffordshire County Council and their delivery partners to deliver sustainable solutions at the best possible value, unfortunately on rare occasions solutions do not perform as hoped.

Since resurfacing in 2019, sadly some early life defects have been seen forming in the carriageway on Shobnall Road and Forest Road which require repair in order to provide a safe means of travel through this part of the county.

The works will commence on **Monday 30 January 2023** for a period of **four weeks**, and during this time reconstruction of the carriageway, the resetting of the ironwork and the replacing of the road markings will be undertaken.

Due to the nature and scale of the plant used in a complex operation such as this, sections of Shobnall Road and Forest Road will at times become impassable, so a full road closure will be enforced to prohibit through traffic between Grange Street and Kings Road for the duration of the scheme, with various phased temporary road closures in place between the hours of 8.00am and 5.00pm protecting the live works.

A signed diversion route will be in position for the individual closures; along with designated personnel at either end of the closure points to offer advice; and the direction of your travel will be determined by the whereabouts of the workforce along Shobnall Road / Forest Road at that time.

Outlined in the table above, is the time when the respective phased closure will be in position affecting our premises; but during the period of 30 January until 15 February please try and enter and egress from the Anslow direction, and alternatively from 16 until 24 February 2023 (during half-term) from the Town Centre direction, this will ensure that you have an uninterrupted journey.

Both pedestrian and vehicular access along the length of the works will be maintained throughout the reconstruction operation; however, there may be times of short restriction as essential repairs near to our premises are carried out.

Unfortunately, with any major highway works, some disturbance is unavoidable, and there may be short delays even on the approaches to the closure points, so we must ask that you drive carefully and slowly through any sections of live roadworks for both the workforces and your own safety.

It should be pointed out that the aforementioned times may be subject to change, due to the possibility of any inclement weather conditions.

UKHSA Back to School Advice

As pupils and students return to school following the Christmas break, UKHSA is reminding people that winter illnesses continue to circulate at high levels.

Following simple steps can help protect children, minimise the spread of illness in education and childcare settings and protect wider communities.

Flu and coronavirus (COVID-19) are <u>currently</u> <u>circulating at high levels</u> and are likely to continue to increase in coming weeks. High

numbers of scarlet fever, which is caused by group A streptococcus, also <u>continue to be reported</u>.

Professor Susan Hopkins, Chief Medical Adviser at the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA), said:

It's important to minimise the spread of infection in schools and other education and childcare settings as much as possible. If your child is unwell and has a fever, they should stay home from school or nursery until they feel better and the fever has resolved.

Helping children to learn about the importance of good hand hygiene is also key, so practice regular handwashing at home with soap and warm water. Catching coughs and sneezes in tissues then binning them is another simple way to help stop illness from spreading.

Adults should also try to stay home when unwell and if you do have to go out, wear a face covering. When unwell don't visit healthcare settings or visit vulnerable people unless urgent.

Remember that flu vaccination is still available for all eligible groups and is the best protection against the virus. We have seen good uptake in older age groups but vaccination among young children remains low. Flu can be very unpleasant and in some cases can lead to more serious illness. Getting your child vaccinated protects them and others they come into contact with, and it's still not too late.

Eligible children include:

- those aged 2 and 3 on 31 August 2022
- all primary school-aged children
- some secondary school-aged children

Nursery

We have had a lovely first week back with the nursery children all looking energised and refreshed for the new term ahead! Our new topic 'All Aboard!' has begun this week with a story called 'The Naughty Bus'. Some children have created a junk model bus, painted pictures and taken part in our role play 'Bus' themed area. We have also learnt what being resilient means. We listened to the story about Romeo Resilience and completed the Commando Joe challenge by trying hard and not giving up, no matter how difficult the challenge is!

Reception

We have had a short but fantastic first week back in Reception! It has been wonderful hearing all about the children's Christmas fun and they have all had something to share and lots of questions to ask.

We have had a fabulous time sharing some of our favourite books with a wonderful variety including, The Tiger who Came to Tea, Oi Frog, Arctic and Antarctica, Tinkerbell, Blaze, Some Dogs Do, and We're Going on a Bear Hunt...



The children were very excited when we created a hot air balloon using the front covers of our books and have used a range of medias to represent their favourite characters.

We were able to explore our new theme 'Food Glorious Food,' when deciding what foods, we would offer the Tiger for tea. There were lots of ideas of what to feed him as the children completed some brilliant writing. They used their phonics knowledge to segment words and recalled phrases to form letters correctly. Year 1

Year 1 have had a lovely week back. They have enjoyed sharing their favourite books with the class and have completed a book review based on their chosen book. They have also looked at what they have been successful at in PSHCE and began looking at their goals. Their first Forest School session also took place this week which was a highlight for them!
