We now await for the Inspection report to be published, which is a lengthy process, but should be available in the New Year. We will endeavour to let you know as soon as it is released.


As always, we hope that everyone has an amazing weekend – whatever it is you are doing, ENJOY! We look forward to seeing you all again on Monday!

Despite Disney's reputation for wholesome, child-friendly content, however, there's far more material available on their platform – some of which is aimed exclusively at adults. This could easily fly under the radar, given the company's general image. Our #WakeUpWednesday guide has useful tips to help your family sit back, relax and enjoy what Disney+ has to offer.

In the guide, you'll find tips on a number of potential risks such as age-inappropriate content, encroaching adverts and binge watching.

need of, please contact the school office via shb-office@shb.jtmat.co.uk and we will ensure this is forwarded to her.


Car Parking

Nursery

Our adventures this week in Nursery......

It has been another wonderful week in Nursery. The fun began on Monday when the children saw the Acting Avenue turn into Santa's workshop! They have absolutely loved going into this new role-play area

helping Santa pack presents ready for Christmas! On Wednesday and Thursday, the children performed the EYFS Nativity 'A Bundle of Joy' and it certainly was a magical experience as the children sang beautifully, added some groovy actions and remembered directions and lines fantastically. We are all extremely proud of all the children for taking part! Later in the week the children had fun completing lots of different activities including making some exciting Christmas cards, decorating stockings, and making some lovely Christmas drawings using the stencils.

We are excited to continue our Christmas explorations next week...

Reception

We are all very proud to have taken part in our nativity performance, 'A Bundle of Joy.' We sang and joined in with actions beautifully as we retold the story of Christmas with our fabulous characters. I'm sure you will agree that we all looked wonderful in our costumes! We have continued the nativity theme in our learning adventures by joining in with lots of activities including writing letters to the wise kings and creating stars using a variety of materials.

There was a shock for us all later in the week as we discovered some polar animals trapped in ice. We carried out an investigation to find out which would be the best way to melt the ice to free the animals. We used some super vocabulary to explain our thoughts and eventually the animals were free!

"It needs to be in a warmer place." (Haider)

"It has to have hot water in it to save the animals, it will melt the ice." (Amore)

"It has frozen up because you put it in the freezer like ice cream." (Thomas)

"The animals need to go next to the fire to get warm the snowman was melting next to the fire as well." (Jensen)

We have also been thinking carefully about the qualities of a good friend and created a friendship soup which included a jar of hugs, a handful of kindness, a cup of smiles and 2 spoons of sharing.

Year 1

Year 1 have had a super week learning all about 2D and 3D shapes. They are starting to become shape experts and understand the difference between a face and a surface. In English they have been



looking at our new unit of writing which is letter writing. The children have thoroughly enjoyed having a post office in the classroom. We have continued learning our nativity songs ready for the performance next week. We finished off the week making our 'Three Little Pigs' house. We have to think about what materials we can use for our roof to make it waterproof as well as what material is best for transparent windows. All in all, an amazing week has been had by all.

Year 2



Y2 have had an amazing week this week! In English they have finally written their diary based on the Great Fire of London. They have all tried so hard and are great at applying their new learning! In maths we have been adding and subtracting two-digit numbers. We have used base 10 equipment and number lines to support our learning. This week in art we have been creating self-portraits inspired by Thomas Gainsborough. The children have enjoyed using some of his techniques in their own exploration! Well done Year 2!

Year 3

Year 3 have had a busy but brilliant week! We have been learning about division and multiplication of 3s and 4s. We have also been writing our own stanza for a poem in English. This week we have been very busy preparing and practicing for our Christmas play! Well done Year 3 on a brilliant week!

Year 4

Year 4 have had another super week. In maths, we have once again been using our knowledge of multiplication and division to learn their 11 and 12 times tables and have also had the opportunity to multiply a number by 0 and 1. In English, we have continued with our unit looking at teeth and in particular this week, we have been identifying the need to include pronouns to avoid repetition. The children also enjoyed a very wet and muddy Forest School session on Thursday! However, despite the weather, the children had a wonderful time creating Roman crowns and jewellery and we even managed to get a fire going despite the weather! A great week Year 4!

Year 5

Year 5 have had another brilliant week of learning! In Maths the children have tackled fractions head-on, learning about; equivalent fractions, fraction fact families, and converting between mixed number and improper fractions. In English, Year 5 have continued drafting and editing their Alien Invasion story. All of the children are LOVING this writing opportunity and are trying especially hard to include a range of ambitious vocabulary, including; sinister, ominous, otherworldly and cantankerous! In Music, Year 5 have finished their unit of learning on sea shanties and were able to perform 'What do you do with a drunken sailor?' by reading musical notation, playing the melody on the glockenspiels, some children playing chords on the keyboards and children from the choir singing in a three-part harmony...what a musical extravaganza! Keep up the great work Year 5!

Year 6

What a fantastic week we have had! In Maths, we have been investigating measurement where we have had to see which unit of measurement is best suited. We then looked at converting units of measurement from grams to kilograms etc. We all really enjoyed this. In English, we have started a new unit learning about reports and we looked at our model text called 'The Peppered Moth' which talks about the theory of evolution. We had to identify the key features of a report because in the next few weeks we are going to write our own report on an animal we choose and discuss how it is adapted to its environment/habitat. In RE, we have been looking at Christmas celebrations and if traditions help Christians to understand and remember Jesus. A really great week, well done to us!


This week's recommended read is for children aged 5+...

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

WHAT ARE THE RISKS? The Walt Disney Company's streaming service, Disney+ combines entertainment from the famous animation dio itself with Pixar, Star and National Geographic, plus the Marvel and Star Wars franchises. With access to the latest releases, Disney classics and original series, there's plenty of content to explore. While parents may have noted that adverts have now been introduced on some versions of the service, the platform is – unsurprisingly for a Disney product – designed to be appropriate for the whole family.

LESS SUITABLE CONTENT

D@*#! While Disney+ is predominantly family friendly, there are some movies and shows in its library which are aimed at an older audience: these may scare younger ones or contain themes or language that you'd rather your child wasn't exposed to. You could avoid such situations by enabling Junior Mode (see 'Adjust content settings', below) or specifying a content age rating for your child's profile.

BINGE WATCHING DO

With the option to view content on any internet-enabled device and a growing catalogue of movies, cartoons and documentaries, cartoons and documentaries, cartoons and documentaries, carton make managing screen time difficult. This could result in children binge watching content, distracting them from activities like homework or socialising. Too much screen time has also been shown to negatively impact mood, sleep patterns and weight.

PHISHING EMAILS

Be especially cautious if you receive emails or text messages purporting to be from Disney+. There have been numerous reports of online scammers impersonating Disney+ staff in an attempt to gain access to subscribers' personal information. Disney+ states it will never email or call customers asking for their payment details, their private information or their password.

ENCROACHING ADVERTS

Disney+ has introduced a new subscription package – Disney+ Standard with Ads – which plays commercials before movies and during shows (like many TV channels). There are no adverts in Junior Mode, but profiles with a content rating of 6+ years will see ads appropriate for that age category. Adults who give consent will see personalised adverts based on their location and viewing history.

ACCESSING ADULTS' PROFILES

Advice for Parents & Carers

ADJUST CONTENT SETTINGS

When setting up an account, there's an option to create profiles in what's called Junior Mode. This generally covers material that's suitable for children up to age 6 and is therefore fairly limited. You can give older children a wider choice of viewing by building a standard profile, then going into the settings and choosing a content rating from one of the pre-set alternatives: 6+, 9+, 12+ or 14+.

TURN OFF AUTO-PLAY

When a cartoon, show or movie finishes, Disney+ uses algorithms to identify content with similar themes, which it thinks your child will also enjoy. This suggestion will then automatically begin to play by default. There's an option to turn off this auto-play function in the profile settings, which will encourage your child to take a break from the screen and move on to a different activity.

ADD PIN PROTECTION

Disney+ enables you to effectively lock profiles behind a four-digit PIN. In particular, some of the shows on the platform's Star content hub are far more oriented to adults (including several hard-hitting dramas from US networks), so protecting parents' or older siblings' profiles with a PIN will help to prevent younger children stumbling across material which isn't intended for them.

ENJOY AS A FAMILY

When your child watches a movie or show on Disney+ for the first time, you may want to sit with them to ensure it's suitable. You could do the same when introducing them to older films that you haven't seen for years; your perception of what's appropriate has very probably changed, and some of the language and attitudes in movies from your own childhood may seem quite shocking today.
