Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We support and encourage all children to become confident, successful learners. Promoting personal, social and emotional development is part of our daily practice. Skills we will be learning....

Making Relationships

Take account of one another's ideas about how to organise their activity.

Self confidence and self awareness

Speak to others about own needs wants, interests and opinions.

Talk about their ideas, and choose the resources they need for their chosen activities.

Managing feelings and behaviour

Be able to negotiate and solve problems without aggression, e.g. when someone has taken their toy.

Adjust their behaviour to different situations, and take changes of routine in their stride.

Mathematics

This half term children will be counting, ordering and using ordinal numbers. They will further explore the concepts of addition, patterns and shape.

Skills we will be learning....

Numbers

Estimate how many objects they see and check by counting them.

Finds one more from a group of objects.

Begin to use the vocabulary involved in adding.

Place numbers in order and say which number is one more or one less than a given number.

Using quantities and objects, add two single-digit numbers together.

Shape, space and measure

Recognise, create and describe patterns.

Explore characteristics of everyday objects and shapes and use mathematical language to describe them.

Expressive Arts and Design

Children will be encouraged to explore a range of resources and techniques to develop creative skills. They will listen carefully to music in order to move appropriately to it.

Skills we will be learning....

Exploring and using media and materials

Understand that different media can be combines to create new effects.

Select tools and techniques needed to shape, assemble and join materials they are using.

Dance, and experiment with ways of changing it.

Being Imaginative

Create simple representations of objects.

Represent ideas, thoughts and feelings through dance, role play and stories.

Physical Development

During this half term children will continue to develop their gross and fine motor skills, and will explore movement in response to music.

Skills we will be learning....

Moving and Handling

Travel with confidence and skill around, under, over and through balancing and climbing equipment.

Uses a pencil and holds it effectively to form recognisable letters, most of which are formed correctly.

Health and Self-care

Shows an understanding of the need for safety when tackling new challenges, and considers and manages some risks.

Know the importance of a healthy diet.

Understanding the World

We will be thinking about Superheroes in our own family and community, will be exploring the qualities of materials and will develop an awareness of changes over time.

Skills we will be learning....

People and Communities

Shows an interest in different occupations and ways of life.

Talk about past and present events in their own lives and in the lives of family members.

The World

Know about similarities and differences in relation to places, objects, materials and living things.

Talk about the features of their own immediate environment and how environments might vary from one another.

Technology

Complete a simple program on a computer.

Communication and Language

Speaking, listening and understanding underpin everything we do and is embedded throughout the day and within each activity.

Skills we will be learning....

Listening and Attention

Listen attentively in a range of situations.

Listen to stories, accurately anticipating key events and respond to what they hear with relevant comments, questions and actions.

Understanding

Follow instructions involving several ideas or actions.

Answer 'how' and 'why' questions about their experiences and in response to stories or events.

Speaking

Uses talk to organise, sequence and clarify thinking, ideas, feelings and events.

Link statements and stick to a main theme or intention.

Develop own narratives.

Literacy

We will be reading a range of stories linked to our topic which will provide the basis for our writing this half term. In daily phonics sessions children will begin to learn Phase 3 phonemes, while continuing to read and write Phase 2 key words.

Skills we will be learning....

Reading

Use vocabulary and forms of speech that are increasingly influenced by their experiences of books.

Know that information can be retrieved from books and computers.

Read and understand simple sentences.

Use phonic knowledge to decode regular words and read them aloud accurately. Read some common irregular words.

Writing

Begin to break the flow of speech into words.

Attempt to write short sentences in meaningful contexts.

This half term children will be counting and comparing numbers. They will further explore the concepts of addition, counting on, weight, 3D shapes and using money in role play situations.

Skills we will be learning....

Numbers

Count reliably with numbers from one to 20.

Using quantities and objects, they add two single-digit numbers and count on to find the answer.

Solve problems including doubling.

Shape, space and measure

Use everyday language to talk about weight to compare objects and to solve problems.

Estimate, weigh and order objects.

Explore characteristics of everyday objects and shapes and use mathematical language to describe them.

Expressive Arts and Design

Children will be able to experiment with a variety of materials and techniques and will engage in observational drawings and paintings.

Skills we will be learning....

Exploring and using media and materials

Make music, and experiment with ways of changing them.

Safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with design, texture and form.

Being Imaginative

Create simple representations of objects.

Represent ideas, thoughts and feelings through design and technology, art, music, role play and stories.
