Think Before You Park

It's the first week back and the school run can be hectic. Staffordshire Police and their partners are urging parents and carers to park safely, considerately and legally around schools.



Over the next few weeks they are highlighting the need to be aware of pedestrians, other roads users and local residents when dropping your children off or picking them up from school. One way to ease congestion is that if you can't walk to school from your home consider parking further away from the school and walking the last five or 10 minutes. We are very fortunate in that The Albion are happy for our parents to park their vehicles in their car park so as to ease congestion around the school! Please utilise their facilities.

There are rules on parking, make sure you aren't parking dangerously or causing issues for others. It's important that you do NOT park:

- on zig zags and double yellow lines
- in a way that blocks access for emergency vehicles
- opposite to or near to a junction
- on a bend

- near the brow of a hill
- near a school entrance, bus or tram stop
- over or on the driveway of a property
- over a dropped kerb
- on the pavement - this can cause problems for parents with prams, wheelchair or mobility scooter users and the elderly.
- on or near crossing points where a school crossing patrol operates, this can impede their view, making the crossing unsafe



Another common issue is drivers leaving their engine running when waiting for their children. Idling increases, the amount of exhaust fumes in the air and therefore reduces the air quality around the school where children are walking. Consider the environment and the health of the local community and turn the engine off when you're parked up.

Let's have a sneaky peek as to what has been going on in our classrooms this week...

Nursery

Our nursery children have had a fantastic first full week! They have settled in so well and it is lovely to see them beginning to interact with each other in their play. Some daily routines are slowly being introduced and the children have done exceptionally well sitting on the carpet during story time. They have all been showing super listening skills we are so proud of them! This week in nursery we have also been very creative as we have been focussing on the book 'Penguinpig' and the children have been busy creating their own crazy animals and learning all about not trusting everything online.

Reception

It has been a wonderful week in Reception with the children eagerly arriving to school with big smiles on their faces! We are all so proud of how well they have settled into their new routine.

They have enjoyed joining in with lots of exciting activities linked to the story 'The Colour Monster,' by Anna Llenas. The children have shown a super understanding of the different ways they feel and have been learning about various strategies to support their different feelings by using our wonderful well-being area.



After having lots of fun decorating their house in the role play area and finally getting the removal van delivery the children are all unpacked and settled in. There has been lots of fun and laughter as they compared the different paint colours and wallpapers in their new home, as well as, making each other cups of tea and the occasional hot chocolate!

The children have also enjoyed singing some of their favourite rhymes and shared some fabulous books focussing on different types of families. This led them onto sharing all about their own families by presenting their fantastic family representations they completed for homework.

As with our class routines the transition to the hall for lunchtime has continued to be a huge success as the children follow instructions well and use wonderful manners.

All of the children should be very proud of the brilliant start they have made in Reception!



Year 1

Year 1 have settled into class wonderfully! They are becoming more independent with their routines and trying extremely hard with their learning. This week we have been focussing on 1 more and 1 less in Maths as well as comparing numbers. During English, children have written fantastic descriptions of the Gruffalo using adjectives. Well done Year 1 for a great week!

Year 2

Year 2 have had a fantastic week of learning! They have settled into their routines and understand the expectations and it has been wonderful to see how independent they have become in their work already. In Maths, the children have been looking at Place Value using tens and ones as well as comparing numbers using the greater than/less than sign. All children showed a fantastic understanding of numbers and breezed through the work showing superb problem-solving skills along the way. In English, Year 2 have been writing Police Reports for the Gingerbread Man. The children thoroughly enjoyed this unit of writing and were able to retell the key events in chronological order so that they could charge the fox with the crime of eating the Gingerbread Man! In the afternoons, Year 2 have had a brilliant time learning about pitch, rhythm and the beat in Music. They were able to use percussion instruments to accompany their singing, as well as singing the 1666 version of 'London's Burning'. What a great week!

Year 3

Year 3 have had a wonderful few weeks in KS2 and have settled in fantastically. In Maths, we continue to look at the place value of number up to a 1,000 and Miss Barker is extremely impressed with what the children have retained from last year. We have nearly finished our unit of Poetry and the children have thoroughly enjoyed being able to write their own autumnal poem. In History, we have been learning all about chronology and the events that took place during the Stone Age. Keep up the amazing work Year 3 - well done!

Year 4

Year 4 have had a wonderful week this week. I have been so impressed with how well the children have settled into the routines and expectations in Year 4. I have been astonished by the level of presentation and care the children have taken in their work this week. In maths, we have been looking at place value and how to represent numbers in a variety of different ways. Furthermore, in English the children have written a recount to Charlie and The Chocolate Factory, and I have loved reading these! Across the curriculum, we have continued our History unit, where the children have been learning about the Romans, the Punic Wars and how Hannibal used elephants to cross the Alps in 220BC! Well done on a fantastic week Year 4. Keep it up!



Year 5

Year 5 have thoroughly enjoyed science this week as they have designed and carried out an investigation looking into which paper towel is the most absorbent. We have been reading *Cirque du Freak* and started to look at JK Rowling's Harry Potter books. It has been great to see how different authors use techniques in their writing to allow us to practice relative clauses. We have also had fun in Maths learning Roman numerals with a song and actions.

Year 6

This week the children in year 6 have been working hard in maths which has involved revising efficient methods for the four operations. English has been an engaging lesson this week, where flashbacks are our focus. We have been looking at an interesting animation called "The Piano" where an old man has flashbacks whilst playing the piano. The children have been really engaged and seem to be enjoying the writing genre. Overall, I am really impressed with how hard the children have worked this week.

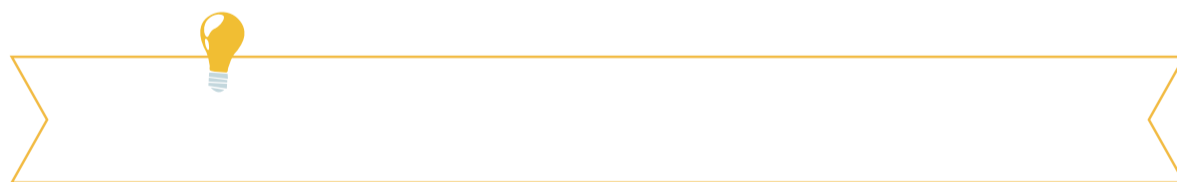
