Equipment:

- Orange
- · Four cocktail sticks
- Sweets
- · Candle
- · Red ribbon

Instructions:

- Tie your red ribbon in a bow around the centre of the orange.
- 2. Place some sweets on your cocktail sticks.
- 3. Insert your cocktail sticks evenly around the centre of your orange.
- Place your candle in the hole that your teacher has made at the top of the orange.

The app gained notoriety for its viral dances, trends and celebrity cameos and can be a creative, fun platform for teens to enjoy. Now available in 75 languages, it has more than a billion active users worldwide (as of spring 2022) and is most popular with the under-16 age bracket. In fact, a 2022 Ofcom report found TikTok to be the most-used social media platform for posting content, particularly among young people aged 12 to 17.

In the guide, you'll find tips on a number of potential risks such as ageinappropriate content, dangerous challenges and contact with strangers.




FREE Uniform!

Reception Adventures this week...

We have had a great time completing some wonderful writing showing our phonics knowledge. We segmented to spell words which helped us to write sentences and formed our letters neatly!

It was wonderful to join in with a melting investigation when we found lots of polar animals trapped in ice! The vocabulary we used was fantastic as we explored what had happened and how we could melt the ice to save the animals.

Our nativity rehearsals have been going well and we have had fun singing the songs all day long! We can't wait to share it with you next Wednesday and Thursday.

Today it is 1st December and the Christmas celebrations have begun! We opened the windows on our class advent calendars and also used 10 frames to solve how many more sleeps are left until Santa visits! Year 1

In maths this week the children have begun learning all about 3D shapes. The children have enjoyed being able to learn the different mathematical names of different shapes. In English, the children have finished writing a recount of their lives. They have being used their phonics knowledge to spell words as well as using full stops and capital letters. In RE, we have been looking at important gifts and why they are special to us. The children have been learning their songs for the nativity and have begun practising on the stage. The children thoroughly enjoyed Science today where they had to create their own homes for the three little pigs to shelter inside. Miss Barker (the wolf) used her hair dryer to try and knock them down. We all had a great time and were surprised by the results. A great week Year 1- keep it up!

Year 2 have had a great week! They have been continuing to write their diary entry from The Great Fire of London and have been using visuals of the fire to help generate their vocabulary. 
Year 3


Year 3 have had a busy week! They have been working hard on multiplication and division in Maths. In
