Save the Bees



The Facts



Bees are in decline on a global scale. They face many threats such as the destruction of their natural habitat, climate change and parasites and disease.



We depend so much on bees in our ecosystem, that there would be serious consequences if they were to disappear.

Most plants and crops depend on animal pollination, and one third of our food crops depend on bees.



If you see a bee struggling, gently put it onto a beefriendly flower. You could also offer the bee a drop of sugar water. This could give it enough of an energy boost to fly off. Another way to help bees is to have lots of bee-friendly plants in your garden or balcony. Some examples of flowers that bees love are lavender, marigolds and wildflowers.
