

School Meals



- Free School Meals introduced September 2014 for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 Pupils
- Menu choices available on school website/weekly newsletter
- Self registration with pupil choice each morning

Are you eligible?

Schools get pupil premium funding based on the number of pupils they have in January each year from the following groups:

- free school meals
- looked-after and previously looked-after children
- service premium

Free school meals are available to any family in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400 (£616.67 per month)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- · the guarantee element of Pension Credit
- · Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190

You can find out of you are eligible by clicking on the link above, which will take you to the Staffordshire County Council website. Please ensure you have your National Insurance (NI) Number and children's date of birth handy before you do. There are two screens to complete and you should get an answer immediately.

Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) was originally launched in 2008. It is the statutory framework for all early years providers in England but it is held in high regard worldwide. The Statutory Framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage sets the standards that all early years providers must meet. Early years providers in England who provide care and learning for children from birth to the end of reception class must comply with the EYFS Statutory Framework. Ofsted regulate and inspect all early years providers against the safeguarding and welfare requirements and areas of learning to determine how well children are kept safe and healthy. From time to time the EYFS is updated and refreshed, so far this has happened in 2012, 2014, 2017 and 2021!

Class Dojo

- An online learning platform used for your child's Learning Journey and homework.
- It's a two-way information sharing platform.
- Details/ consent are included in your pack. Please return these during the transition sessions.
- You will be emailed your own personal code as an invitation to join.
- Further details will be shared during the meet the teacher meeting.



Reception Baseline Assessment (RBA)

- It is now a statutory requirement that all children in Reception are baselined during the first few orientation weeks in September.
- This takes place 1:1 with a familiar adult.
- The children have a range of tasks to complete, some involving practical resources.
- Each assessment lasts around 20 minutes.
- The results are reported to the DfE and used to inform our planning.

Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum – 7 Areas of Learning


The 7 areas of learning and development within the EYFS are:

EYFS Profile

- At the end of the Reception year, children are assessed against each of the 17 Early Learning Goals (ELGs) from the Statutory Framework.
- They are judged as to have 'met' or 'not met' the goal.
- This information is reported to parents and carers.
- This supports for smooth and effective transition into Year 1.
- This is NOT a formal assessment procedure, practitioners use 'best fit' judgements using teacher knowledge of each child.
