
• Children need to have sufficient physical development of their preferred arm, hands and fingers to hold a pencil and move a pencil comfortably. GMS-FMS.








All School settings are now required to promote the "good oral health of children" which was introduced following research by Public Health England.


Children will be taught about healthy eating habits and dental hygiene.








The RBA is a short, interactive and practical assessment of your child's early literacy, communication, language and mathematics skills.
