

JTMAT considers excellent school attendance as paramount to pupils achieving their full potential and therefore, enhancing lifelong outcomes. It is central not only, to academic attainment but in developing children socially, morally, ethically and in enhancing well-being. It is with this in mind, that we set expectations of excellent attendance for all our pupils. Being in school and having the best attendance possible underpins all the many benefits of school for your child, such as their learning, wellbeing, and wider development.

For some children, attending school every day will be harder than for others. This is why Shobnall Primary & Nursery School is committed to working together with families to solve problems and support your child's school attendance. Therefore, each child enrolled at our school is expected to attend every day, on time so that they can achieve their full potential. We monitor and manage attendance and punctuality across all year groups according to the JTMAT Attendance and Punctuality Policy and statutory guidance. With all the statutory changes being implemented nationally over the summer, I thought it would be useful for you to receive a short summary of these changes as an accompaniment to this letter.

In addition to this, <u>school uniform</u> plays a key role in promoting pride, self-confidence, and a feeling of belonging.
